InfoTrac (Magazine Index/ Plus) is a comprehensive computerized index to over 430 of the most popular and widely read magazines. In addition, the database provides current cover-tocover indexing of The New York Times and The Wall Street Journal.

The complete text of approximately 300 of these 430+ journals is available in our new MAGAZINE COLLECTION – a user-friendly microfilm collection

which offers instant access and coverage back to 1989. By subscribing to this service, we instantly added 100 magazine titles to our periodicals list.

WHAT HAPPENED TO THE CARD CATALOG?

Progress! The library is moving quickly to catch up with technology. The card catalog is now online! More than half of the library's collection is now online—the rest is expected to be completed by January.

We moved the card catalog from its former location in order to place emphasis on the new online catalog. Why? Because we want people to use the online catalog first when looking for a book. You will find it very simple to use. In fact, you will probably begin to wonder how you ever got

by with just the card catalog.

The online catalog lets users quickly search the library catalog with an easy yet powerful searching method. Simply type in the title, author, or subject and the system leads you not only to your choice, but will indicate the availability of the item. Online help screens are a keystroke away. Of course, library staff is always available to assist you.

Once the entire online catalog is complete, the circulation system will streamline check-in and check-out with barcode scanning, and will maintain patron records and reserves without time-consuming manual recordkeeping.
