This year was one full of Library Facility projects. The Library's original building was constructed in 1987 with the upstairs level added in 1997. As stewards of the facility, the Board of Trustees approved the replacement of the Library's original air conditioning system and fire alarm panel systems. A concrete walkway was installed in the Library's backyard to enable a sturdier pathway for emergency exits. The Library replaced an area of siding as well as a repainting. Lastly, the roof was re-covered. The Board and Staff appreciates the community's support in completing these necessary projects.
